### Lunches

We have introduced a new lunch ordering system. Thank you for your patience as we iron out the initial glitches.

We will now be asking you to order your child's lunch via the Microsoft Forms links below for each week. You will be sent these in advance of each half term and be asked to complete them before a deadline.

Once the deadline has passed, we will not be able to accept any more orders for school lunches, this means that there can be no ordering of hot school lunches on the day. You will be able to save your forms so you can remember what you have ordered for your child and the class teacher will go through this in class each morning.

All children need to have ordered a lunch in advance, this includes all Pre-School and KS1 children.

Paying for school lunches is still via School Money and you will be invoiced for this.

A polite reminder that children & siblings are not permitted to play on the playground equipment before for and after school. We are unable to staff the equipment and are therefore not insured for its use at these times.

### Uniform

Why wear a uniform? Wearing a uniform creates a sense of belonging to the CGPS community. It teaches children to dress smartly and take pride in their appearance.

**Parent's role:** Dressing each morning is part of preparation for the day ahead. It is important parents encourage & support this so that children are in the right mind set for learning & success.

#### Please make sure all items of uniform are clearly named.

#### Required

- Grey trousers, shorts, skirt or pinafore dress
- Green and white checked dress -summer only
- White shirt or polo shirt
- Green sweatshirt, cardigan or jumper with or without the school logo
- Grey or white socks, white, grey or green tights

#### Hair

- Hair styles should be appropriate for school
- Shoulder length hair must be tied back Hair accessories with flowers, large bows etc are not part of school uniform

Jewellery: for safety reasons jewellery must not be worn. However, if your child has pierced ears, small plain stud earrings may be worn.

There is no obligation to purchase school logo uniform. Many high street shops & supermarkets sell suitable clothing. However, **should you wish to purchase school merchandise please visit** <u>Make It Mine</u>

Lost Uniform. We have a lost property area. Please ask a member of staff if you would like to check for an item of lost property. Named items that end up in lost property can easily be returned

#### What if I cannot afford the uniform, or I wish to consider sustainability?

Our 'nearly new' uniform shop is managed by a school parent, Please speak to the office if you would like to either **donate or access** uniform.

#### Variations on the policy

The school will consider carefully reasonable requests to vary the policy, to meet the needs of any individual pupil to accommodate their religion or belief, ethnicity, disability or other special considerations. Parents must put requests in writing to the Headteacher.
