Age Appropriate Homework Expectations

Spelling Expectations	Practice spellings for 10 minutes each day Age appropriate words can be found on the class pages of the school website
Reading Expectations:	Read for 10 minutes each day and record your progress in your Reading Record. Reading Records should be in school every day and will be checked at least once a week. Please refer to age appropriate 'Reading Fluency Skills' on the class pages of the school website
Maths Expectations:	Count, read and write numbers up to 100 in words and numerals. Count in steps of 2, 5 and 10. Number bonds to 10.

Dedicating time each day to homework & helps you to form effective learning habits.

Topic Tasks

Please pick activities to complete with your family. Homework should be a positive experience, the discussion & fun you have with your family is just as important as the outcome. Enjoy!

Draw a picture of someone in your family. Write a sentence to describe them. Remember to start your sentence with a capital letter, use finger spaces and end it with a full stop. <i>English</i>	Choose a book to read and write a review about it. Think about what you liked/didn't like and why. Identify the author and illustrator and then draw a picture of your favourite character or your favourite part of the story. <i>English</i>	Read your favourite fairy-tale and innovate the story by changing the characters. <i>Reading</i>
Practise counting items around your house. Line them up and practise writing the number of items you have found. What is the biggest number you can find? What is the smallest. <i>Maths</i>	Practice addition and subtraction facts to 6. Could you ask an adult to write some number sentences for you to complete? <i>Maths</i>	Go on an autumn walk – how many different signs of autumn can you find? What different coloured leaves can you find? <i>Science</i>
Paint a picture of the people in your family. Say a prayer in thanksgiving for your family. If you can, try to mix some of the colours when you're painting. <i>RE</i>	Design and make a toy using materials you have at home. You could use empty boxes, bottles or bottle tops. <i>DT</i>	Collect different materials and describe what they feel like and what they are made from. <i>Science</i>
Create a piece of autumn artwork. You could use fallen leaves to create leaf rubbings or create an autumn collage. Talk with an adult about seasonal changes during autumn. <i>Art</i>	Can you use some technology to take some photographs of a family celebration or tradition? <i>Computing</i>	Design a postcard that could be sent from a trip to Wallingford/Crowmarsh. Draw a picture of a Wallingford/Crowmarsh landmark and write some sentences about what you can do here. What are your favourite things to do in Wallingford/Crowmarsh? <i>Geography</i>

There is no right or wrong way to complete the tasks. Take as long, or as little, time as you like. A large project may take a number of weeks.

Bring Topic Tasks to school in any way you like: email, photo, written, scrap book, artwork, edible... You can send any photos that you take to the class teacher via Seesaw or print them out to show the class.

Additional learning may be sent home as appropriate.
