Please pick activities to complete with your family. Homework should be a positive experience, the discussion & fun you have with your family is just as important as the outcome. Enjoy!

.Find out more about the importance of the River Nile in Ancient Egypt <i>History</i>	Create a map of Ancient Egypt and mark on important landmarks. You could add extra information about these places <i>History</i>	Find out about what homes would have been like in Ancient Egypt <i>History</i>
Visit the Ashmolean Museum in Oxford and look at the Ancient Egypt collection <i>History</i>	Design a poster or information page to explain how MRS GREN helps us to remember what living things need to survive <i>Science</i>	Create a classification key to sort different animals, plants or trees <i>Science</i>
Make a bug hotel <i>Science/ DT</i>	Choose an animal and find out about its habitat <i>Science</i>	Go on a local walk and take photos of different types of trees. Do you know the names of the trees? <i>Science</i>
Write your own short story based on The Promise <i>English</i>	Draw, paint or make a city landscape based on The Promise <i>English/ Art</i>	Draw or paint a still life picture (e.g. food, flowers, plant, trees) <i>Art</i>

There is no right or wrong way to complete the tasks. Take as long, or as little, time as you like. A large project may take a number of weeks.
