Age Appropriate Homework Expectations:

Spelling Expectations	Practice common exception words for 10 minutes 3 x a week List of words can be found on the class pages of the school website
Reading Expectations:	Read for 10 minutes each day and write in your Reading Record. Please refer to age appropriate 'Reading Fluency Skills' on the class pages of the school website
Maths Expectations:	Recall and use addition and subtraction facts to 20. Use pairs to 10 to begin to calculate pairs to 100. (Tens to start with e.g., 70 + 30, before moving onto Tens and ones e.g., 47 + 53) Count in steps of 2, 3, and 5 from 0, and in tens from any number, forward and backward. Begin to recall multiplication and division facts for 2, 5 and 10 times table.

Dedicating time each day to homework & helps you to form effective learning habits.

Topic Tasks

Please pick a different activity to **do with your family each week**. Completing your homework with your family should be a positive experience, the discussion & fun you have is just as important as the outcome. Enjoy!

There is no right or wrong way to complete the task. Take as long, or as little, time as you like on these tasks. A large project may take a number of weeks.

Bring Topic Tasks to school in any way you like: email, photo, written, scrap book, artwork, edible... You can send any photos that you take to the class teacher or print them out to show the class.

Create a maths counting song or rhyme to help you count in 2s, 5s or 10s (Maths)	Create a family tree for Queen Victoria. (History/English)	Find out about the Victorian Empire - create a map showing which areas of the world were part of it. (Geography)
Design and write a postcard sent from a seaside holiday in Victorian times. (Art/History)	Find out about Victorian toys. Make a one of these toys using materials of your choice. (DT)	Design a Victorian wordsearch or crossword puzzle. (English)
Find out about some famous Victorian inventions and create a poster showing what you've found out. (History)	Research the different types of jobs in Victorian times. Create a job advert for one of those jobs. (History)	Find out some foods the Victorians liked to eat and use these to design a menu for a Victorian café. (DT)
Write a diary entry of a working child in Victorian Britain. Write about your typical day, what kind of things you do, and how you feel. (History/English)	Listen to a piece of music by a Victorian composer, e.g. Holst or Elgar. Draw a picture of, or describe, what the music makes you think of and feel. (Music)	Design an outfit for a poor or rich person to wear in Victorian times. Label the materials and features of the outfit. (Art)
