Spelling Expectations	Practice common exception words for 10 minutes 3 x a week List of words can be found on the class pages of the school website
Reading Expectations:	Read for 10 minutes each day and write in your Reading Record. Please refer to age appropriate 'Reading Fluency Skills' on the class pages of the school website. Read a page or 2 in your head and ask someone to ask you questions about what has happened.
Maths Expectations:	Recall and use addition and subtraction facts to 20 and related facts to 100 Use knowledge of counting in 2s, 5s and 10s to answer multiplication and division questions.

Dedicating time each day to homework & helps you to form effective learning habits.

Topic Tasks

Please pick a different activity to **do with your family each week**. Completing your homework with your family should be a positive experience, the discussion & fun you have is just as important as the outcome. Enjoy!

There is no right or wrong way to complete the task. Take as long, or as little, time as you like on these tasks. A large project may take a number of weeks.

Bring Topic Tasks to school in any way you like: email, photo, written, scrap book, artwork, edible... You can send any photos that you take to the class teacher or print them out to show the class.

Write a superhero poem – you could try an acrostic poem, a shape poem, or even a performance poem complete with superhero sound effects! <i>(English)</i>	Think about your own personal hero. Write all about them and explain why they're your hero. You could also include pictures. <i>(PSHE)</i>	Look at the superhero artwork by the artist Andy Warhol. Have a go at recreating one of his artworks or creating an original superhero work of art in the same style. <i>(Art)</i>	Write a superhero story, remembering to think about the main stages of the story (opening, build-up, problem/climax, resolution and ending) <i>(English)</i>
Write some superhero-inspired word problems and then solve them. <i>(Maths)</i>	Create a new outfit or vehicle for a superhero. Think about what different materials the outfit/vehicle would be made from and why. <i>(DT)</i>	Design a set of superhero top trumps or an exciting superhero board game. <i>(Maths/DT)</i>	Make up your own superhero dance, rap or song to perform to the class. <i>(English/Music)</i>
Create a picture of a superhero using collage materials (for example paper, tissue paper, straws, buttons, feathers, foil etc) <i>(Art)</i>	Create a menu for a superhero restaurant. Be as imaginative as you like, you may include a starter, main and pudding, and side dishes too if you'd like to. <i>(DT)</i>	Create a factfile about your favourite superhero or superhero enemy. <i>(English)</i>	Design a superhero hideout: where would you locate this and why? Draw and label your work. You could even create a model of it! <i>(Art/DT)</i>
Invent a new enemy character. Draw and write about them - whose enemy are they? What powers do they have? Where do they live? etc. <i>(English)</i>	Draw a superhero / city using 2D shapes. You could include a list of the shapes you have used. <i>(Maths/Art)</i>	How many different parts of your body can you balance on to create a stunning superhero pose? Ask someone to take photos of you! <i>(PE)</i>	Investigate animals that have 'superhero' senses and write about how these help them survive in the wild. <i>(Science)</i>

Additional learning may be sent home as appropriate.
