Spelling Expectations	Practice spellings 10 minutes each day for Age appropriate words can be found on the class pages of the school website
Reading Expectations:	Read for 10 minutes each day and write in your Reading Record. Please refer to age appropriate 'Reading Fluency Skills' on the class pages of the school website
Maths Expectations:	Times tables up to 12 x 12 out of sequence at increasing speed Related division facts Number bonds to 100

Dedicating time each day to homework & helps you to form effective learning habits.

Topic Tasks

Please pick a different activity to **do with your family each week**. Completing your homework with your family should be a positive experience, the discussion & fun you have is just as important as the outcome. Enjoy!

There is no right or wrong way to complete the task. Take as long, or as little, time as you like on these tasks. A large project may take a number of weeks.

Bring Topic Tasks to school in any way you like: email, photo, written, scrap book, artwork, edible... You can send any photos that you take to the class teacher or print them out to show the class.

Make a musical instrument using junk modelling <i>Science/ DT</i>	Go on a sound walk around your house and garden. Note down or record what you can hear <i>Science</i>	Create a quiz based on what you know about sound <i>Science</i>
Make a wordsearch using different sound vocabulary <i>Science</i>	Create your own ancient medicinal herbal remedy. You could use real herbs and spices or use things from your garden <i>History</i>	Draw and label a picture of inside a medieval hospital. You could add more information about what it would have been like <i>History</i>
Go to the library (or use the school one) and choose a non-fiction book on any topic that interests you. Share the book with others at home <i>English</i>	Choose one of the characters in The Wolves in the Walls. What advice would you give them to help them with a problem that they have? <i>English</i>	Write your own short story in the style of The wolves in the walls <i>English</i>
Create a poster showing who your friends are and why you choose to spend time with these people <i>PSHE</i>	Research any sculpture of your choice and recreate the piece of work <i>Art</i>	Make a game e.g. pairs, top trumps that would help someone to learn their times tables <i>Maths</i>
