Age Appropriate Homework Expectations

Spelling Expectations	Practice spellings for 10 minutes each day Age appropriate words can be found on the class pages of the school website
Reading Expectations:	Read for 10 minutes each day and record your progress in your Reading Record. Reading Records should be in school every day and will be checked at least once a week. Please refer to age appropriate 'Reading Fluency Skills' on the class pages of the school website
Maths Expectations:	Count, read and write numbers up to 100 in words and numerals. Count in steps of 2, 5 and 10. Number bonds to 10.

Dedicating time each day to homework & helps you to form effective learning habits.

Topic Tasks

Please pick activities to complete with your family. Homework should be a positive experience, the discussion & fun you have with your family is just as important as the outcome. Enjoy!

Write a postcard to a friend describing what it is like in space. <i>English</i>	Miss Rahman wants to go to space for a week. You will need to create a list of what you will need to take with you. <i>English</i>	identify, compare and describe different garden plants. Go to the park or into the garden and see how many different plants you can spot. What is similar/ different to these plants? Can you spot anything all plants need? Draw the plants and take photos – label them.
Go on a tree hunt and find out what the different trees are called. Make a chart to record the names of the different trees you see. <i>Science</i>	Mass/weight Follow a recipe to bake some biscuits or cakes. Can you weigh out all the ingredients yourself? Find food in your kitchen, such as a tin of beans. Can you find something which is heavier and something which is lighter? <i>Maths</i>	Fractions of shapes- Find things you can cut into halves and quarters, e.g a pizza, a cake, an apple. Ask your grown up to draw some circles on a page. Can you split them into halves and quarters? <i>Maths</i>
Can you create a poster about Neil Armstrong? <i>History</i>	Use different materials to create a 3D model of a space rocket. <i>DT</i>	Design your own healthy eating diary and record any new food that your try. <i>DT</i>
Research a Local sculpture and draw it using pencils. <i>Art</i>	Write a story about yourself and think about why it is important to tell stories <i>RE</i>	Research 10 facts about British Space history. <i>History</i>

There is no right or wrong way to complete the tasks. Take as long, or as little, time as you like. A large project may take a number of weeks.

Bring Topic Tasks to school in any way you like: email, photo, written, scrap book, artwork, edible... You can send any photos that you take to the class teacher via Seesaw or print them out to show the class.
