Age Appropriate Homework Expectations

Spelling Expectations	Practice spellings 15 minutes each day Age appropriate words can be found on the class pages of the school website
Reading Expectations:	Read for 20 minutes each day and write in your Reading Record. Note down any new words or phrases you like in your home reading journal Please refer to age appropriate 'Reading Fluency Skills' on the class pages of the school website Reading comprehension homework set weekly
Maths Expectations:	Practise all times tables for continued fluency and speed Maths homework set weekly

Dedicating time each day to homework & helps you to form effective learning habits.

Topic Tasks

Please pick a different activity to **do with your family each week**. Completing your homework with your family should be a positive experience, the discussion & fun you have is just as important as the outcome. Enjoy!

There is no right or wrong way to complete the task. Take as long, or as little, time as you like on these tasks. A large project may take a number of weeks.

Bring Topic Tasks to school in any way you like: email, photo, written, scrap book, artwork, edible... You can send any photos that you take to the class teacher or print them out to show the class.

Class debate – 'Year 5 children should only get 30 minutes for lunch'. You need to be prepared to argue for this! <i>English</i>	Write and present your own 'I have a dream' speech. <i>English</i>	Try something new. Choose a book that you would never normally pick up and read the first 2 chapters. <i>Reading</i>
Visit a new place and go geocaching. <i>Maths</i>	Go orienteering! <i>Maths</i>	Explore melting and freezing. <i>Science</i>
Design and make your own board game. <i>DT</i>	Find out about 3 jobs you might be interested in. Create pros and cons for each job. <i>PSHE</i>	Research Spencer Silver and make a poster about his achievements. <i>Science</i>
Make a piece of Roman style jewellery. <i>Art</i>	Plan for and run a lemonade stand. <i>STEM</i>	Grab a bag and gloves and go litter picking. <i>Geography</i>
